He will have to explain the delay in reporting the death. He will have to explain the dirt all over the body. The best of these explanations would not sound good for him. Accidents happen. They happen less often if hunters take the Missouri Hunter Safety Course. They happen less often if new hunters go out in the company with experienced hunters. When they happen, they look less suspicious if reported immediately.

I read something by one of the usual suspects. The author claimed that James Madison did not know that the real reason for the Second Amendment was for a government National Guard. They are more likely to be published and more likely to be read. Send these letters to other media. The weekly newspapers are more likely to print them. Send them to magazines of general interest and web sites. Use social media. People are repeatedly told that even gun owners want gun bans. If that is all people hear they will believe it.

Great Falls gun shop re-opens after a visit from federal agents

A Great Falls gun shop owner says he was targeted by federal agents Wednesday. In fact, he claims that he's been in the crosshairs of the government for a couple of years now "At 7:30, I came in and they pulled in behind me with 20 heavily armed agents," said Tom Van Hoose, the owner of Highwood Creek Outfitters.

Van Hoose says for two years his Highwood Creek Outfitters gun shop has been the subject of surveillance by state and federal agencies including the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Occupational Safety & Health Administration, the Department of Homeland Security, the State of Montana and now the Internal Revenue Service.

"The fact that they think we make so much money as a gun business that they had to come investigate all the thousands, hundreds of thousands, millions of dollars whatever it is we supposedly absconded with, anybody that knows the margins in the gun business knows they're not that high," said Van Hoose.

Van Hoose says all he was told is that his business had been reported. He doesn't know by whom, or the reason. He thinks it's part of a nationwide pattern and feels it's political.

"I can only assume that it's because of the style of weapons that we have and the press that's so against them," said Van Hoose. "The current administration seems to be hell bent on getting those guns out of the hands of average Americans."

Van Hoose says the agents were cordial and professional, but still felt invaded and now has lost nearly a whole day's revenue.

"I got 30 minutes of operating time in and made one \$16 sale," said Van Hoose.

Van Hoose says his shop has a good relationship with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Fiearms, which was also present. He says because his shop carries "fun guns" like AR-15's and AK-47s their level of licensing draws more scrutiny.

"We have a reputation of dotting all the i's and crossing all the t's because there's so much legal fun to be had," said Van Hoose. "It's just not worth doing things that are going to get you in trouble."

Cascade County Sheriff Jesse Slaughter says there is no law stating that the sheriff must be notified prior to any such investigation by federal agents.

The Great Falls Police Department was notified of the investigation and provided security.

The Montana Department of Justice said that it had no involvement in this incident.

An IRS spokesperson confirmed to MTN News that the agency was at Highwood Creek Outfitters on official business but declined to provide any details.

According to a news release from U.S. Representative Matt Rosenadale (R-MT), the IRS confiscated all the 4473 forms from the store. According to the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms website, generally, the forms must be completed at licensed business premises when a firearm is transferred over the counter.

PRESIDENT'S CORNER

STATE CONSTITUTION CHANGE

A group proposes to change Missouri's constitution to eliminate our preemption law. Since 1984 Missouri's Uniform Firearms Law, RSMo 21.750 ("preemption") has prohibited most local laws from being more restrictive than state law. Missouri's preemption law is often criticized as preventing local governments from having local laws regarding firearms and ammunition. It does nothing of the kind. Local laws do exist and can be more restrictive than state law involving open carry and firing guns in the city limits.

A group called "Sensible Missouri" has filed three proposals for a Missouri constitutional amendment that out-

law's preemption. The group intends to conduct polls to see which of the three is most likely to pass.

The effect of such a constitutional amendment would be to gut our concealed carry law. Kansas City and St. Louis are certain to pass ordinances against the possession and use of firearms. The proposed amendment will be touted as a panacea for record murder rates and heavily publicized mass killings. The murder-inclined will not obey such ordinances and they will be used to harass innocent citizens.

Going to a range will often require going through two counties and several cities. Obeying the multiple, perhaps conflicting ordinances will entrap Missouri shooters. There are already multiple cases of people crossing state lines and violating adjoining state laws. If the 114 counties in Missouri and thousands of towns have different laws innocent persons will be the victims.

It is argued that, unlike every other law, city gun laws must be more restrictive. The idea that city residents are less trustworthy is rejected by the 14th amendment to the US Constitution. The proposed amendment will be carried on the argument that "we must do something" about the murder rate. That is not quite correct. We must do the *right* thing. The right thing is hard. We cannot concentrate on the right thing when silly distractions like this proposed amendment are advanced.

A CHEAP LEGAL MEMO

FOURTH OF JULY CONSEQUENCES

The Fourth of July came and left in an evening of fireworks. Again I heard gunfire. This is not new. A few years ago men celebrating the 4th fired a handgun into a lake. A bullet skipped off the surface like a flat rock skips across a pond. A child on the other side was killed. The gun's owner was charged and took responsibility for the death. He was found guilty of manslaughter and went to prison.

People are frequently injured or killed by celebratory gunfire. The result of a negligent discharge can be manslaugh-

ter or second degree assault. Both can result in prison.

Mere firing a gun in the city limits is a crime. Jail time is possible but the usual result is a fine, probation and likely loss of the gun. County ordinances may also limit shooting. State law prohibits shooting at or from a house or at or from a vehicle or along a roadway.

Any of these charges will result in handcuffs, bail, attorney fees and jail. Killing a child will haunt the celebrant for the rest of his life.

The result will affect other gun owners. People are frightened by random gunfire and demand stricter gun laws. The child killed on the prior 4th has inspired "Blair's Law" which increases the penalty for firing in the city limits. The opposition takes this as a victory.

I have defended such cases. But I charge extra for stupid.

SAF SUES PENNSYLVANIA SHERIFF TO STOP WARRANTLESS SEARCHES

The Second Amendment Foundation today filed a challenge of Pennsylvania's promulgated firearms regulation and its enforcement by the Pennsylvania State Police and Montgomery County Sheriff's Office, which includes warrantless searches.

SAF is joined by Shot Tec, LLC and a private citizen, Grant Schmidt. They are represented by attorneys Joshua Prince and Dillon Harris, Civil Rights Defense Firm, of Bechtelsville, Pa. Defendants are Col. Christopher Paris, commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) and Montgomery County Sheriff Sean Kilkenny, in their official capacities. The action was filed in the Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania.

The petition challenges Col. Paris and the PSP's "interpretation, implementation and enforcement" of the firearms regulation "which is being enforced" by Kilkenny, according to the court filing. The petition alleges that Sheriff Kilkenny "has implemented a policy...which he contends, based on the PSP's promulgation and implementation of (the regulation) permit him, in the absence of probable cause and a warrant and in violation of...the Pennsylvania Constitution, to come into those...homes or business."

Plaintiffs further assert this inspection enables the sheriff to impose sanctions against holders of state licenses to sell firearms "for not having 'safe storage" in the event of an emergency when the PSP has "failed to promulgate any regulations addressing what constitute 'safe storage' or sufficient safeguards...when the General Assembly *only* delegated to the PSP the ability to establish such standards."

"The State Assembly has never enacted a law allowing for warrantless searches of licensees, but the state police promulgated a regulation requiring licensees to submit to such searches, which are now planned by the sheriff's department," said SAF Executive Director Adam Kraut. "We believe there are grave constitutional issues involved in this scheme, particularly when an administrative agency simply waives an individual's constitutional rights by implementing a regulation without any framework from the legislature. Equally troubling is the Sheriff's assertion that he would revoke a license from an individual asserting their right to be free from unlawful searches and seizures. We have filed this petition to ensure constitutional rights are respected."

SAF founder and Executive Vice President Alan M. Gottlieb observed, "No statute should allow *carte blanche* regulations to be imposed by any law enforcement agency because of the inherent danger of overstepping legal authority and constitutional protections which must be protected in a free society. We're seeking a remedy from the court to stop this, especially when warrantless searches are involved."

Senator Braun's offers amendment to protect Second Amendment from "national emergency declaration" gun control

Senator Mike Braun offered an amendment on Thursday to the Pandemic and All-Hazards Preparedness Act that would prevent President Biden and the Department of Health and Human Services from declaring gun violence a public health emergency for the purpose of instituting gun control measures and infringing on Americans' Second Amendment rights.

"National and local politicians across the country are always trying to restrict the rights of law-abiding citizens," Sen. Braun said. "We need to set into law that no one can declare a national health emergency to seize the power to restrict our Second Amendment rights with the stroke of a pen. I will always stand up for Hoosiers' rights to protect themselves and their families."

President Biden, HHS Secretary **Xavier Becerra**, and Senator **Alex Padilla** have called for gun violence public health emergencies.

Senator Braun's amendment would protect Americans' right to bear arms from executive branch infringement by affirming that the HHS Secretary does not have the authority to institute gun control by declaring gun violence a public health emergency.


Senator Braun's remarks during the markup meeting of the Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Committee:

"During the COVID-19 pandemic, Americans saw Big Government flourish and many of our constitutional rights be diminished. More and more, big government wants to turn everything into a national emergency.

"Recently, the Secretary of Health and Human Services advocated for gun violence to be declared a public health emergency to grant HHS power to restrict Americans' right to keep and bear arms. The Department of Health and Human Services was never intended to implement gun control of any kind.

"My amendment would simply prohibit HHS from declaring a public health emergency to implement gun control. I urge my colleagues to vote yes on my amendment."
